

William Milford, (Died 27 May 1935), Duncannon Record, May 30, 1935; **William Milford** Died from Injuries Received at Aqueduct

Losing control of the bicycle he was riding while descending Aqueduct hill Monday afternoon, resulted in the death of **William Milford**, 13 year-old-son of **Mrs. Thomas Baskins**, of Penn Township.

The bicycle and rider running wild down the hill collided with a stone wall at the residence of **Mrs. Samuel Potter** at the bottom of the steep declivity and the rider badly injured and in an unconscious condition was taken to the Harrisburg Hospital by Dr. John E. Romig, of this place, where his death occurred shortly after 11 o'clock the same night.

In addition to his stepfather, and mother, **Mr.** and **Mrs. Thomas Baskins**, he is survived by a half brother and two half sisters at home.

Funeral services will be conducted at his late home Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. H. P. Baker, pastor of the First United Brethren Church, will officiate.

Interment will be made in the Duncannon Cemetery. The body may be viewed Thursday evening.
