Miller, Curtin W. (4 Oct 1863 – 25 Jul 1943)

Curt W. Miller, son of **Isaac Pfoutz** and **Margaret Ellen Miller**, was born in Pfoutz Valley, October 4, 1863.

When he was four years old, his people removed to Loysville. He attended the public schools and later learned the printing trade in the office of the Perry County Times. He located in the territory of Arizona, in 1883. He served as chief clerk of the House of Representatives of the twenty-first and twenty-second sessions of the Territorial Legislature, 1901-03. He served two years as secretary of the Board of Education of the Tempe Normal School of Arizona, and one term as postmaster of Tempe. For eight years he was a captain of the National Guards of Arizona, and since February, 1916, has been chairman of the Board

of Pardons and Paroles of the State of Arizona.
