

**MILLER**, Kenneth V. (Died 7 Nov 1879), The Newport Ledger, November 8, 1879

Accident.-Friday morning a little **son** of **George Miller**, residing in the house opposite the Pennsylvania railroad telegraph tower, one mile west of Newport, was struck by the engine of the Mifflin accommodation, and was knocked off the track. When picked up the lad was insensible. The little fellow is aged about seven years, and was sent by his mother across the road for some milk when the accident occurred. Dr. H. Stites was sent for by the family, who examined the injuries and found the skull fractured near the temple and symptoms of a fracture of the base of this skull. Dr. H. O. Orris, railroad physician, was also in attendance. The doctors have very slight hopes of the boy's life, as he vomits blood, and blood also discharges from his ears and nose
