

Samuel Milliken, (10 Jun 1813 – 24 Jan 1890), Elizabeth Herald, Friday, Jun 11, 1886; Dr. Shaffer's Reminiscences.

Samuel Milliken lived in the brick on the corner of Second and Bayard Street. He did not do a very great amount of work outside of his duties as general supervisor of the yard. He was quite popular among the hands, and was a general favorite everywhere. He was head of considerable of a family and it was on one of his little boys that Dr. Porter performed the operation of tracheotomy. Mr. Milliken lost two of his children with scarletina during the epidemic of 1849, when twenty-nine children died. He subsequently removed to the point opposite McKeesport. He was interested in the Coursin boat-yards for a time and then entered into the lumber business. He has no representative in town.
