

William R. Milliken, (22 Dec 1861 – 5 Jun 1934), Huntingdon Daily News, Wednesday, June 6, 1934 p 7

William R. Milliken, one of Huntingdon's oldest coal dealers and formerly in the taxicab business here, died Tuesday evening, June 5, 1934, at 8:30 o'clock at his home, 316 10th street, death being due to a complication of diseases.

He was born in Juniata, Pa. December 22, 1861, a son of **Samuel** and **Elizabeth Milliken**. He was aged at the time of death 72 years, 4 months and 13 days.

Mr. Milliken was united in marriage to **Emma McCune**, deceased, to which union three children were born: **Mrs. W. C. Miles**, Tyrone; **Mrs. C. R. Davish**, Lebanon and **William Guy**, deceased.

On July 24, 1902, he was united in marriage to **Ethel C. Barrick**, to which union two children were born: **Frederic J.**, at home, and **Mrs. M. R. Greene**, this city. He is survived by a sister, **Sadie Peck**, of Duncannon.

He was a past member of the P.O.S. of A., Eagles, Moose and Heptosaphs. He was a member of the first M. E. Church.

In early years, he was associated with the Blair Manufacturing company, later going in to the coal business. In later years, he entered the taxi business, retiring from active business due to ill health in 1932.
