

Dr. Edward Everett Moore, (23 Apr 1865 – Mar 1930), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

Dr. Edward Everett Moore, one of Perry County's most prominent physicians, who practiced medicine in this for forty-three years, died in a Harrisburg hospital at half after eight o'clock Tuesday morning, following a complication of disease. He had not been in good health for more than a year past although he was able to continue to practice his profession, which he did up until the day before he went to the hospital. He was unconscious for two days: preceding his death during which time his devoted wife and daughter, **Mrs. Aubrey Patterson**, were in constant attendance at his bedside.

Edward E. Moore was a son of **Robert A.** and **Annie (Withrow) Moore** and was born April 23, 1865, at the Moore homestead, two miles east of Bloomfield. He was aged 64 years, 10 months, and 10 days. He attended public school and the Bloomfield Academy and when a young man taught school several terms at Airy View and Comp's. He then read medicine with the late Dr. George W. Campbell, of Newport, and was graduated from Jefferson Medical College in 1887 and in that year began the practice of his profession in Bloomfield. He was very successful in Bloomfield. He was very successful and soon acquired a county wide practice, and up until his last illness was a very busy man, on the go day and night, which no doubt shortened his life many years, but with the true spirit of his profession. He sacrificed himself in ministering to others in the discharge of his duty as a physician. His death is deeply regretted and his will long be remembered for his life of service and sacrifice. He always gave more than he received.

Dr. Moore was first married to **Miss Clara Lahr**, of Millerstown, September 4, 1890. To this union two children were born, **Francis (Mrs. Aubury Patterson)** of near Millerstown, and **Lieutenant Edward L. Moore**, who was killed in action, in the World War (I) in France, September 30, 1918. **Mrs. Moore** died August 5, 1921. In May 1923, **Dr. Moore** married **Miss Jissie Kingsboro**, who survives with two small children, **Robert** and **Nancy Ann**. Three grandchildren are also living.

The deceased was a member of the Perry Medical Society, and was physician to the students of Carson Long Institute and also county jail physician. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church.

Funeral services will be held at his late home in this place on Friday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, the Rev. Dr. William Baldwin, of the Presbyterian Church, officiating, and burial will be in the Bloomfield Cemetery.
