

**Mrs. Mary (Livingston) Moore**, (10 Dec 1823 - 2 Oct 1879), The Newport Ledger, Saturday, October 4, 1879

Sudden death. Thursday evening a sad scene was witnessed in the residence of Dr. J. B. Singer, in the death of **Mrs. Samuel Moore**, of Howe Township. **Mrs. Moore** was in town on business, having come over in the morning, and just at dusk she and **Mr. J. W. Frank** walk down Second Street to J. B. Leiby's store. **Mrs. Moore** completed her business at the store and walk to the residence of Dr. Singer, where she expected her son or husband to meet and take her home in a conveyance. The doctor met her at the door and invited her in. She took a seat and in a very few minutes, in fact while conversing with the inmates, her head was notice to fall forward and her breathing seemed heavy. The doctor at once went to her, and rendered her all the assistance in his power; but human aid availed nothing, for in a few moments she ceased breathing and was pronounced dead. The doctor pronounces it a cause of apoplexy. **Mrs. Moore's** age was fifty-five years. She leaves a husband and three children, two sons and a daughter, to mourn her sudden death. Truly" in the mist of life we're in death."
