Jack H. Morgan, 84, of Duncannon died Wednesday, Nov. 30, 2011.

He was born Sept. 23, 1927 in Duncannon, where he resided all his life.

He was diagnosed with polio at age 5 and spent two years constrained in a body cast at Elizabethtown Hospital. He was left crippled and had to learn how to walk again. He went on to graduate from Duncannon High School, where he earned a full academic scholarship.

He was forced to quit college early to care for his ill mother, **Reba**. After she died, he worked as a machinist at Progressive Dye Service for 50 years. Each day he returned to the home he had built and to the love of his life, **Nancy Morgan**, and their two children.

When he was 74, another wave of polio struck, confining him to a wheelchair. He was diagnosed with severe prostate cancer four years ago.

He was a member of the Duncannon American Legion and VFW.

Surviving are a daughter, **Whitney** of New Cumberland; a son, **William** of Duncannon; two granddaughters, **Richelle** and **Erin** of New Cumberland; and three grandsons, **Joshua**, **Chris** and **Michael**.

A graveside service was held Dec. 5 in Union Cemetery, Duncannon.
