

Jacob E. Murray, (16 Sep 1812 - 5 Jan 1881), Patriot, Friday, January 7, 1881, Sudden Death.

Jacob E. Murray, who, while rocking his grandchild, at the residence of his son, **Frank E. Murray**, 220 Mulberry Street, this city, died suddenly on Wednesday.

His cane dropped from his hand, which attracted the attention of the family, when it was noticed that his head drooped and inclined to one side. They at once went to his assistance. He was unconscious and was removed to a sofa. The family physician, Dr. Rabter, was at once sent for, but when he arrived life was extinct.

Mr. Murray was in good health and had expressed himself as feeling wonderfully bright that very morning. Yesterday afternoon a post mortem was made by Dr's. C. A. Rahter, E. H. Coover, Hugh Hamilton, S. R. Gorgas, D. H. Coover, and Mr. George Dock, a medical student, and death found to have resulted from apoplexy.

Mr. M. was for many years a resident of Liverpool, Perry County, where he was well known and highly respected.
