

Sara Ann Nesbit, (30 Oct 1861 – Oct 1907), Perry County Democrat, October 1907, New Bloomfield

Miss Sara Ann Nesbit, whose home was in this place, died while on a visit to her sister, **Mrs. Wm. H. Sheaffer**, in Blain Saturday morning of last week. Her death was the result of internal injuries, sustained about eight years ago, caused by over-lifting, while nursing her aunt, the late **Miss Ann Kirkpatrick**. **Miss Nesbit** had been in delicate health nearly ever since, but was confined to bed only one day before her death.

Miss Sara Ann Nesbit was a daughter of **William** and **Magdalene Nesbit** and was born in Ickesburg, this county, October 30, 1861. When a little tot of two-and-a-half years of age she fell down stairs and broke her right hip, which left her ever after a cripple. Shortly after her accident she was brought here to her aunts, the late **Misses Ann** and **Sara Kirkpatrick**, with whom she made her home up until their death. Her parents moved from Ickesburg, to McConnellsburg, Pa., and both are now dead. Five brothers and one sister survive, namely: **Samuel, John, Charles, William** and **Albert Nesbit**, of McConnellsburg, and **Ida**, (Mrs. **Wm. H. Sheaffer**) of Blain.

Miss Nesbit was a consistent member of the Bloomfield Presbyterian Church, having joined the church when a young girl. Notwithstanding her crippled condition she was always bright and cheerful and had as kind a heart as ever throbbed in any girl's bosom. She will be greatly missed by her many friends.
