

**Master Sergeant Marlin Cloyd Orris**, (14 Sep 1914 - 25 Aug 1944), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians

**M/Sgt. Marlin C. Orris** 29, son of **Mr. and Mrs. Martin L. Orris**, Carver's Hill, Duncannon, died August 25, in India from injuries suffered in an airplane accident. He had served variously in the Army Air Forces as mechanic, engineer and pilot. He was stationed on the Burma frontier at the time of his death.

**Sergeant Orris** enlisted November 27, 1939, and received training at Scott Field, Ill., Chanute Field, Ill., and Walker Field, Kan. He was stationed in Porto Rico, Panama and South America before going to the other side of the Atlantic last April.

Recently he received a note of commendation from his commanding officer upon completion of nine cargo missions and four combat missions by the sergeant and his crew in the India China area.

In addition to his parents he is survived by three brothers, **Howard Orris**, Marysville, **Pvt. Stanley Orris**, of Camp Lee, Va., and **Lester Orris**, at home, and two sisters, **Miss Ruth Orris**, West Fairview, and **Mrs. Morris Engle**, Hummelstown.
