

Eleazor Owen, (4 Jan 1858 - 27 Jun 1921), Peoples Advocate and Press, June 29, 1921

Eleazer Owen, a life-long resident of Wheatfield Township, held in highest esteem by all who knew him, died Tuesday morning of this week from complications after an illness of three or more years.

The deceased was a son of the late **Joel B.** and **Sarah A. (McCoy) Owen**, and was born at the Owen homestead in Wheatfield Township. He was 63 years, 5 months, and 21 days at the time of his death.

January 11, 1883, he wedded **Sarah C. Wallace**, daughter of **Robert Wallace** and wife, of Carroll Township, who survives him with the following, out of a family of eight children born; **Robert E. Owen** of Duncannon; **Myrtle, Mrs. Charles Reed**, of Penn Township; **Annie, Mrs. J.E. Ebersole**, of Wheatfield Township; **Nellie, F., Mrs. John Zeigler**, of Wheatfield Township; **W. Ayres**, at home, and **A. Lee Owen**, of this place. There also survive the following brothers and sisters; **G.W. Owen**, of Roseglen, **Mrs. J.E. Bruner**, of Carroll Township, **Mrs. A.J. Rathfon** of Indiana; **Mrs. F.B. Leppard**, of Roseglen.

Mr. Owen received a common school education and supplemented this with a course of instruction at Bloomfield Academy. For a number of years he was one of this county's most successful teachers, giving earnest, serious work in his pupils, instructing morality by precept and example, as well as by the provided school curriculum. From early boyhood he had been a consistent member of United Brethren Church and died in the faith. He was a Democrat in politics and held local townships offices for years. He was a good citizen in the best sense of the word.

Funeral services will be held at Snyder's Church, with the Rev. H.B. Baker, his pastor, officiating. Interment in the graveyard adjoining the church.
