Chas. W. Reamer was born near Markelville, February 8, 1871, the son of Geo. W. and Susan C. (Freeburn) Reamer. He attended the public schools there, and at Marysville, where his family moved in 1883. He studied telegraphy and was employed as a telegraph operator of the Pennsylvania Railroad, from 1887 to 1890, and by the Western Union and Postal Telegraph Companies in Pittsburgh, New York, Chicago and other cities from 1890 to 1898. During this time he took a law course and graduated from the Western University of Pennsylvania with the degree of LL.B. He was admitted to the Bar of Allegheny County in 1898 and has practiced there since then. In 1911 he was appointed a member of the Board of Viewers of Allegheny County.
