Funeral services for **Christian F. Reed**, son of the late **William I.** and **Catherine** (**Bosler**) **Reed**, born January 24, 1854, died July 15th, 1925, of apoplexy of the heart while visiting at the home of his daughter, **Mrs. Charles Gamber**, were held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the home of his son, **Charles T.
