Arthur D. Rhinesmith was born near New Germantown, August 13, 1870, the son of **Samuel** and **Adeline (Deach) Rhinesmith**. He attended the Mt. Pleasant School, and later the school at Blain. In 1891 he located at Peoria, Illinois, becoming a hardware clerk. He later established a business in the Board of Trade building which has grown into a leading cafeteria. In 1919 he organized the Peoria Cafeteria Company, of which he is secretary. As his father had served in Captain Palm's military company in the War Between the States he became active in the Sons of Veterans, and in 1913 was elected State Secretary of that order in Illinois. In 1914 he was elected State Commander. After his term as commander he was again elected State Secretary for a term of three years.
