Chas. W. Rhinesmith, eldest son of **David M.** and **Sarah A. (Smith) Rhinesmith**, was born at Blain, February 10, 1856. He attended the public schools, New Bloomfield Academy, and Eastman Business College, at Poughkeepsie, New York. He read law with the late Judge W. N. Seibert, and was admitted to the Perry County bar in 1882, after which he served three years as clerk to the county commissioners.

He removed to Iowa in 1886, and located at Harlan, where he is engaged in the newspaper business. He served as postmaster at Harlan under Presidents McKinley and Roosevelt. In 1904 he located at Charles City, Iowa, where he again engaged in the newspaper business.
