

William Rowe, (Died 6 Apr 1913), Patriot, Monday, April 7, 1913. Section Crew Man Dies Suddenly.

Newport, April 6 – **William Rowe**, a member of the section crew of the Pennsylvania Railroad, under Silas Kuhn, dropped dead this morning along the tracks east of Newport, just as he was about to begin work. Rowe has not been well for some time, and his sudden death was due to heart failure.

He was born in Cornwall, England, and has been a citizen of the United States for about thirty-five years. The greater part of that time he made his home at Millerstown, but for seven years has been a citizen of Newport. He was fifty years and two months of age, and is survived by his **wife**, a **daughter** of Harrisburg, a **granddaughter**, of Newport, two **sisters** of Cornwall England, and four brothers, **Enoch**, of California, **David**, of Mt. Carmel, Pa., **John**, of Orbisonia, and **Daniel**, of Cornwall, England.

Funeral services will be held at his late home on Third Street, at two o'clock Monday in charge of the Rev. J. C. Collins, D. D., of the Methodist Episcopal Church. Interment will be made at Millerstown.
