Rev. J. C. Rupp, son of **Geo. W.** and **Catherine (Leiter) Rupp**, was born at Liverpool, January 3, 1874. He was educated in the Liverpool schools, Central State Normal School at Lock Haven, and Lebanon Valley College, from which he graduated in 1906 with the A.B. degree. He graduated from Western Theological Seminary, at Pittsburgh, in 1921. Prior to this he had taught school seven years in Perry County, while farming, and learned the printing trade in the office of the Perry County Democrat. He entered the ministry in 1906 and has since served charges at Bigler, Coalport, Wall, and Beavertdale, being located at Wall from 1913 to 1921. His present charge is at Beavertdale. While at Coalport he was assistant principal of the Beccaria Township High School, and while at Wall he was principal of schools for two years and clerk of the borough council for six years.
