**William M. Schools**, Marysville, Perry County, Pa., was born in Lebanon, Pa., September 27, 1824, son of **William** and **Elizabeth (Moore) Schools**, both deceased. He grew up in his native county, and after receiving a somewhat limited education in its schools, he became an apprentice at carpentry, while yet in his early "teens." This trade has been his only occupation through life; ten years ago, he relinquished active work, and has since then led a life of retirement and leisure. He has for thirty-three years been a resident of Marysville, to which place he removed in June, 1863. Mr. Schools has served one year as a member of the borough council, and two years as tax collector. He gives his support to the Democratic Party.

In Union Township, Lebanon County, in 1851, **William M. Schools** was married to **Caroline**, daughter of **Daniel** and **Catherine (Hess) Stein**. After thirty-nine years of married life, **Mrs. Schools** died in 1889. The children of **Mr.** and **Mrs. Schools** are: **Catherine Ann (Mrs. George Strasbaugh)**; and **Elizabeth Jane (Mrs. S. S. Leiby)**. **Mr. Schools** is a member of the Lutheran Church.
