Brinton McClellan Shull was born near Keystone, Perry County, January 17, 1873, the son of **David** and **Leah (Yohe) Shull**. He attended the Rye Township schools for two years, and graduated from the Marysville High School and the Cumberland Valley State Normal School. He received his A.B. degree from Milton University, Baltimore, Md., and has attended the summer sessions of other institutions. He taught in the schools of Dauphin County, and Penn Township, Perry County, also in the graded schools at Marysville, and in the Lower Duncannon High School. He has been grammar school principal, assistant principal, principal of schools, and supervising principal successively at Lehighon, Carbon County, having held his present position for fourteen years. The fine granite-faced high school building at Lehighon, Pennsylvania, is largely due to the work of **Mr. Shull**.
