**Lewis Wayne Shuman** was a son of **John** and **Rebecca Ann (Crane) Shuman**. He was born near Ickesburg, October 4, 1855, educated in the local schools and attended the sessions of '73, '75 and '76 at the New Bloomfield Academy. He taught continuously from 1873 to 1883, three terms in Perry County, three at Earlville, Illinois, and four at Aurora, Nebraska. In the fall of 1883 he was elected clerk of the courts of Hamilton County, Nebraska, of which Aurora is the county seat. He was also a deputy in the county clerk's office, and in the fall of 1891 he was elected county clerk. In 1894 he was elected grand chancellor of the Knights of Pythias of the State of Nebraska. The same year he entered the real estate business, and later located at Long Beach, California, where he resides.
