**Dyson Sweger** was born in Buckwheat Valley, September 21, 1882, the son of **Aaron** and **Martha Ann (Campbell) Sweger**. He received his early education in the public schools, in Prof. W. E. Baker's Summer School at Eshcol, and at the New Bloomfield Academy, graduating in 1904. He later attended the Lebanon Valley College while teaching in the Annville schools. After completing a term in the A. Grammar School, at Newport, in 1906, he went West and located at Los Angeles, where he was first connected with the Pacific Electric Company. In 1911 he entered the Department of Health, and in 1918, through competitive examination, was promoted to the position of Executive Secretary of the Housing Commission—a Bureau of the Health Department. **Mr. Sweger** has charge of all housing and hotel and tenement maintenance in the City of Los Angeles.
