

Dr. Joshua Emanuel Van Camp, (Died 11 Feb 1904), Patriot, February 12, 1904; Well Known Physician Died Suddenly

Carlisle, Feb 1. 11. – **Dr. William Van Camp**, one of the leading physicians of Carlisle died suddenly from a stroke of apoplexy. He was sixty years old. He had gone to see a patient in the county and was stricken while driving his buggy. He was physician to the Board of Health at the time of his death. He enlisted twice during the Civil War, the second time in Hartranft's Division of the 20th, and was prominent in the G.A.R. circles.

He has acquired a large practice in this vicinity, was prominent in church affairs and universally esteemed. He leaves a wife, one son, who is a physician at Plainfield, and two daughters.

Dr. Van Camp is survived by these brothers and sisters: **Joseph M. Van Camp**, a patrolman of Harrisburg; **Mrs. J. M. Flickinger** and **H. W. Van Camp**, Newport, and **Mrs. Albert Eppley**, Carlisle.
