

William L. Van Camp, (Died 9 Jan 1917), Patriot, Wednesday, January 10, 1917; Dies in Bathroom – **William L. Van Camp** Succumbs Suddenly to Acute Indigestion

William L. Van Camp, 59 years old, traveling salesman for the Pennsylvania Milk Products Company, died suddenly at 10 o'clock last night at his home, 551 Curtin Street, from acute indigestion.

Mr. Van Camp had not been feeling well when he returned early in the evening. About 10 o'clock he arose from his bed and went to the bathroom. He had been in there but a short time when his wife heard him fall. When she went to the bathroom she found him dead on the floor.

He is survived by his widow.

He for some years conducted a grocery store at Sixth and Boyd Streets. Joseph Van Camp, ex-patrolman, is a cousin.
