Mrs. Nannie M. Watters, Died at 7 o'clock last evening at her home, 1206 Washington Avenue, death being due to heart trouble. She was born April 25, 1857, being the daughter of **John** and **Mary Milliken**. Her husband met with sudden death on July 13 last when he had gone out in search of berries. Two sons and three daughters survive: **Jesse Watters** of Altoona, **John** of Tyrone, **Mrs. F. J. Wertz** and **Mrs. R. C. Hagerty**, both of Bellwood, and **Mrs. Rose Berkstresser** of Tyrone. A sister and two brothers also survive, **Miss Gertrude Milliken** of Harrisburg, **John Milliken** of Sheridan, Wyoming, and **Roy** of Cleveland. Fourteen grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren also survive. She was a member of the Baptist church. The remains have been taken to the home of the daughter, **Mrs. Berkstresser**, at 1150 Baltic Avenue, from which place the funeral will be held at 2:30 o'clock on Friday afternoon. The services will be in charge of Rev. H. F. King, D. D. Interment will be made in East Lawn cemetery.
