

Jane Elizabeth (Hutchinson) Wax, (Died 4 Sep 1899), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians; Death of **Mrs. Jane Wax**

Mrs. Jane Wax, wife of the late **William Wax**, died of dysentery at the home of her son, **David**, at Blair's Mills, Huntingdon County, on the 4th of September. Her age was about eighty years. Her maiden name was **Hutchison** and a sister of the late **John Hutchison** of Tuscarora Township. She was born at what is now known at Everhart's mill, below Millerstown. Her parents died when she was small, when her aunt, **Mrs. John McCracken**, of near Markelville, took her and raised her. She was married to **William Wax**, of Centre Township and lived in the neighborhood of Markelville for some years and then moved to Scottsville, Huntingdon County; from there to Waterloo, in Juniata County, and in the spring of 1861 moved to Blair's Mills, where they lived until their death. Her husband died on the last day of Aug., 1898. She survived him only about one year and four days. She was the mother of seven children, three boys and four girls. They all survive her except one son who died several years ago. She was a member of the Presbyterian Church and was respected by all who knew her. Her body was laid to its final rest in the Presbyterian graveyard at Waterloo on last Tuesday. 'Blessed are they who die in the the Lord.' J. L. H.
