

Catharine (Roth) Weaver, (1836 – 13 Jan 1899), Perry County Democrat, Wednesday, January 18, 1899, New Bloomfield, PA

Catharine Weaver, wife of **Jonathan Weaver**, of this borough, died of pneumonia at her home on High Street, about six o'clock last Friday evening. She had been ill for about a week, but her condition was not regarded as serious until the day before her death. Her remains were interred in the Bloomfield Cemetery on Monday.

Mrs. Weaver was a daughter of **Conrad Roth, Sr.**, who was a hotel keeper in this borough many years ago, and who has long since been dead. By her marriage to **Mr. Weaver**, the following children survive; **William**, of Cincinnati Ohio; **Virginia**, wife of **R. H. Stewart**, Esq., of Kansas City, Kansas; **George** and **James**, at home, and **Charles** and **Edward**, of Cincinnati, Ohio. A sister, **Mrs. Sibbet**, of Mechanicsburg, also survives.

When **Mrs. Weaver's** illness assumed a serious character, her absent children were sent for and toward the end, when she realized that her life was ebbing fast away, her only wish was that she might live until they arrived, but this was denied to her. Her eldest son, **William**, got here on Saturday, and the first knowledge he had of his mother's death was when he saw the crape on the door. Once entering the house the first object that met his sight was the body of his mother, laid out for burial. The daughter, **Mrs. Stewart**, was so prostrated by the sad news of her mother's death that she was unable to come East to attend the funeral.

Mrs. Weaver was a good and kind mother, and will be sadly missed by her family and friends. She was at the 63rd year of her age.
