

Harry J. Weitzel, (10 Jan 1847 – 9 Nov 1908), Patriot, Tuesday, November 10, 1908, Death of Mr. Harry J. Weitzel

Harry J. Weitzel, aged sixty-two years, died yesterday morning at 10 o'clock at his home, 1622 North Sixth Street. Mr. Weitzel is survived by a wife and three daughters, **Mrs. Harry McDonald, Lula** and **Effie Weitzel**, and one son, **Warren**. Two brothers, **James** and **William Weitzel**, and two sisters, **Mrs. Shriner** and **Mrs. Williams**, both of Sunbury, also survive. The funeral services will take place on Friday afternoon and will be conducted by Rev. Rene Williams, of Messiah Lutheran Church, assisted by Rev. Harry N. Bassler, of Second Reformed Church. Interment will be made in Mumma's Cemetery.

The funeral of **Harry J. Weitzel**, of 1622 North Sixth Street, was held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock from his home. The services were in charge of Rev. Rene H. Williams, assisted by Rev. Harry Nelson Bassler. The selections rendered at the home were Sometime We'll Understand and Asleep in Jesus, and at the grave The Christian's Good Night, was sung as they were lowering the body. Floral tributes were many and beautiful. He was a very well known among the railroad men, having worked for the Pennsylvania Railroad Company since he was seventeen years of age. He was born January 10, 1847, and in 1868 he married Miss **Annie M. Bixler**, of New Buffalo Perry County, who survives. He is also survived by three daughters, one son, two sisters and one brother. He was a very solicitous of his wife and family and no sacrifice was too great for him to make for them. His home life was all that a kind husband and loving father could make it, and although removed from the family circle and we cannot hear that dear voice again, yet his influence will ever be felt among us.
