

Frank J. Wertz, (1 Jun 1873 – 3 Oct 1942), Newspaper Clipping, The Perry Historians; Heart Ailment Is Fatal To Veteran

Frank J. Wertz, a prominent resident of Bellwood, better known to his friends as Cappy, died at the home of a daughter, **Mrs. John J. Estep**, 807 Cambria Street, Bellwood, at 1:40 o'clock Saturday afternoon after one week's illness of a heart ailment. He had resided at 426 North Third Street, Bellwood, until he was taken ill.

Mr. Wertz was born in Bellwood on June 1, 1873, a son of **John C.** and **Emily (Igou) Wertz**, and on Nov. 30, 1893, married **Mary E. Watters**, who died on March 10, this year. He retired from the service of the Pennsylvania Railroad company in 1938. **Mr. Wertz** was a member of the Bellwood Methodist Church, serving as superintendent of the Sunday school for twenty years and as teacher of the Ladies' Bible class at the time of his death. He was a former member of the Bellwood borough council, president of the Bellwood Y.M.C.A. board of directors for five years, and a member of the Tyrone lodge, F. & A.M., the Harrisburg consistory and Jaffa Shrine.

Surviving are two sons and two daughters, **Mrs. Eva M. Lynn**, **Mrs. Ethel M. Estep**, **Chester L.**, and **Charles F. Wertz**, all of Bellwood; five grandchildren, one great-grandchild and two brothers, **Horace G.** and **Willard I. Wertz**, both of Bellwood.
