

Alexander Right White (30 Mar 1857 – 2 Aug 1925), Duncannon Record, Thursday, August 6, 1925

Alexander Right White, aged 68 years, 4 months and 1 day, died very suddenly Saturday evening about eight o'clock following an attack of heart disease. Deceased had visited several down town stores during the evening and was stricken with the fatal attack as he was about to enter the automobile of his brother-in-law, **C. E. Hess**, dying almost instantly.

Deceased was a son of the late **J. M.** and **Sarah Ellen White** and was born in Allen's Cove March 30, 1857. He grew to manhood in the Cove where he followed farming as a means of livelihood. He also resided on a farm in Rye Township for ten years, removing to this place five years ago where he had been employed at the Standard Novelty Works. He was a man of unimpeachable character and integrity, devoted husband and father and a good citizen. His sudden passing has caused extreme sorrow in his home circle and sincere regret in the community in general where he won the respect and admiration of all who knew him. He was a devoted member of the Presbyterian Church and intensely interested in all its activities, serving as secretary of the board of trustees at the time of his death. He was also a member of the Modern Woodmen of America.

Services were held at his late home Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock Rev. Raymond H. Wilson, pastor of the Duncannon Presbyterian church officiating, assisted by Rev. S. A. Bower, pastor of Olivet Presbyterian church, Harrisburg. Interment was, made in the Presbyterian cemetery.
