H. J. Wickey, son of **Rev. Lewis A. and Lydia A. (Wagner) Wickey**, was born at Mont Alto, Pa., November 1, 1870, but was taken to Perry County when about six years old, and spent all of his early life there. He attended the village school at Eschol under Professor William E. Baker. In 1889 he taught his first term of school in Saville Township, teaching three years in Perry County. In 1893 he graduated from the Cumberland Valley State Normal School, and was elected principal of schools of Orbisonia, Huntingdon County, where he remained until 1896. He was then elected principal of the high school at Middletown. In 1899 he was advanced to the superintendency of the schools at Middletown, Pa., which position he is still filling.
