F. P. Williamson, furniture dealer, was born in Liverpool, Perry County, Pennsylvania, October 15, 1849, son of **J. W.** and **Maria (Shell)** Williamson. He was reared and educated in his native town. He learned the tinner trade, which business he followed a number of years. In 1880 he located at Shamokin and entered the employ of J. G. Farrow, furniture dealer, where he remained four years, after which he was employed by the Philadelphia and Beading Railroad Company. In 1886 he purchased the upholstery business of J. G. Farrow, which he conducted until 1888, when he embarked in his present business. Politically, **Mr. Williamson** is a Democrat, and is a member of the Baptist Church. He was married in 1878 to **Ellen M. Cook**, of Liverpool. Pennsylvania, and by this union they have one child, **Emma D.**
