

Samuel Ellis Wilson, (2 Sep 1883 – 25 Dec 1937), Provided by Laura "Randy" Wilson Fennemore; Perry County Times

It is with regret the many friends of **Samuel E. Wilson** of Loysville, heard the sad news of his death, which occurred at the Polyclinic Hospital, Harrisburg, shortly after 9 o'clock on Christmas evening, death being due to complications and came following a severe illness of several weeks duration.

Mr. Wilson was the eldest son of **James E.** and **Frances Dunkelberger Wilson** and was born at Falling Springs. He was married to **Miss Beulah Kistler**, of Elliottsburg, at the Lutheran parsonage in Loysville, April 11, 1907, by their pastor, Rev. W. D. E. Scott. He was a student of Tressler Orphans' Home School, Bloomfield Academy and attended Millersville Normal School one term, was a teacher in Perry County schools for thirteen years. He was in the rural mail service since 1914, serving as mail carrier on Loysville Rural Route 1, and would have been eligible for retirement in 1945. He was a member of the Loysville Lutheran Church and of Adams Lodge, No. 319, F. and A.M., New Bloomfield, was a member of the Rural Letter Carriers' Association of Perry, Juniata and Mifflin counties. **Mr. Wilson** was efficient in the performance of his duties, conscientious in regards to his work, serving his patrons with ability and in the most efficient way, was trustworthy in all his undertakings and had a wide circle of friends who with his family will sincerely mourn his loss. At the time of his death he was aged 54 years, 3 months, and 23 days.

Surviving him are his wife, a son **James Wilson**, of Newport, and a daughter, **Anna, Mrs. Charles Wise**, New Bloomfield; one daughter, **Marguerite**, died in 1927; also surviving are a granddaughter, **Elinor Ann Wise**, his father, **James E. Wilson**, Loysville, and a brother, County Commissioner **Harry C. P. Wilson**.

Funeral services were held at the residence in Loysville, today, Wednesday, at 11 a.m., his pastor, the Rev. J. Grover C. Knipple, officiating.
