Clyde Edward Zimmers, 91, formerly of Marysville, died Friday, July 8, 2011 at Kinkora Pythian Home, Duncannon.

He was born Jan. 23, 1920 in Altoona to **Jacob Clyde** and **Pearl (Grimminger) Zimmers**.

He was a retired aircraft mechanic from New Cumberland Army Depot; and a member of Trinity Reform Church, Marysville, and a former member of Glenvale Church of God, Rye Twp., teaching Sunday school for more than 50 years at the churches, and a member of the Pennsylvania Railroad Band and played clarinet in the local country western band, The Dog Patchers.
